

## Support PCPTP

If you believe:

- Parents/guardians are the primary sexuality educators of their children.
- Young people deserve comprehensive and accurate information about sexuality and reproductive health.
- Policy and program development addressing teen pregnancy prevention should be based on current research and proven strategies.
- Young people should have access to safe and confidential sexual and reproductive health care.
- The promotion of a culture that recognizes sexuality as normal and promotes respect and responsibility will lead to a reduction in negative consequences of sexual behaviors.
- Pregnant and parenting teens should have access to quality health care, education and support services, with the main goal of promoting health and preventing repeat teen pregnancies.
- In the event of unprotected intercourse or when regular contraception fails, emergency contraception is an acceptable method of preventing pregnancy.
